EPA FLEXIBILITY ALLOW 82 NURSING ASSOCIATE APPRENTICES TO COMPLETE AT TEESSIDE UNIVERSITY

From 9th April The Institute for Apprenticeships and Technical Education (IfATE) has been supporting new flexibilities for Registered Nurse (RN) Degree Apprentices and Nursing Associate (NA) Apprentices that were due to complete End Point Assessment (EPA) this summer, but due to Covid-19 had been unable to take their EPA.

The new flexibilities have meant that for those apprentices who meet the requirements they will be regarded as having met the End Point Assessment (EPA) and have achieved their apprenticeship.

The success of the Covid-19 EPA flexibility can be seen in the North East, where 62 Nursing Associate Apprentices will now able to achieve their apprenticeship with Teesside University, with a further 20 apprentices due to benefit from the EPA flexibilities in June.

These apprentices will be able to now enter the workforce and add their vital contribution to the NHS. Teesside University say this is a positive outcome for both the learners and their employers
