Where can I find Apprenticeship vacancies in the health sector?

As an apprentice you will be employed so vacancies will be advertised. We recommend looking at NHS
Jobs or the government's Apply for an Apprenticeship website for current vacancies. Some employers will only make the Registered Nurse apprenticeship available to existing staff.

We would recommend that you contact your local NHS Trust's Human Resources department to find out what plans they have for registered nurse apprenticeships.

You may want to consider applying for a Healthcare Support Worker post which will give you experience of working in health providing care and can be advantageous when applying for a Registered Nurse apprenticeship.

Do I meet the entry requirements?

Entry requirements will usually be the same for apprentices as those applying through UCAS.

Entry requirements for nursing degree courses vary because each university sets its own entry criteria, but you are likely to need at least two (usually three) A-levels or equivalent qualifications at level 3, plus supporting GCSEs including English, maths and a science (usually biology or human biology).

When you apply for the apprenticeship the advert should set out the entry requirements agreed between the employer and the University where you will study.
