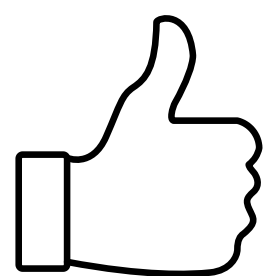

end-point assessment

training and assessment

off-the-job training

on-programme assessments (tripartite progress reviews)

additional learning to retake end-point assessment

additional learning and/or the cost to re-sit an exam linked to a mandatory qualification

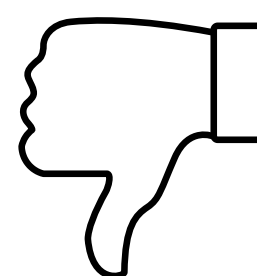
accommodation for training delivered through residential modules

administration directly linked to training and assessment

registration, examination and certification costs associated with mandatory qualifications, excluding any licence to practise

personal protective clothing

safety equipment

capital purchases including lease agreements

maintenance of capital purchases

travel costs

apprentice wages

student membership fees

enrolment, main provider (or subcontractor) induction, initial assessment, initial diagnostic testing

mentoring apprentices, where this is not delivering training required as part of the apprenticeship (e.g. generic line management responsibilities).

repeating the same regulated qualification where the apprentice has previously achieved it

accommodation costs where the apprentice is resident away from their home base

end-point assessment costs incurred by the main provider

English and maths up to level 2 (this is funded separately)

fees to third parties associated with a licence to practise

off-the-job training delivered only by self-directed distance learning

specific services not related to the delivery and administration of the apprenticeship

fees to awarding bodies for non-mandatory qualifications

development of original teaching materials related to the delivery of a new apprenticeship offer

any training, optional modules, educational trips or trips to professional events in excess of those required to achieve the apprenticeship

residential costs associated with non-mandatory learning
