We spoke to Paula Davies, Head of Education, from North West Ambulance Service NHS Trust. The trust offers a diverse range of apprenticeships. Read on to find out more about their experiences.

1. Briefly describe your organisation

North West Ambulance Service NHS Trust provides prehospital emergency and urgent care, patient transport and a 111 first service to the people of the Northwest of England. Our service covers over 5000 square miles and employs over 6000 staff across Cumbria, Lancashire, Cheshire, Merseyside and Greater Manchester.

2. Which apprenticeships do you currently offer?

We offer the Associate Ambulance Practitioner at Level 4 for our EMTI (Emergency Medical Technician) roles, the Level 6 Paramedic (Degree) apprenticeship as part of our in-service conversion, Emergency Services Contact Handler at Level 3 as well as other support service apprenticeships including finance, communications, fleet and business administration.

3. What benefits have apprenticeships brought to your organisation?

Apprenticeships have increased the visibility of all careers in the Ambulance service, even those which have historically been graduate entry. Our apprenticeship model has helped our organisation plan our workforce more effectively as well as enabled a more regulated approach to preparation for some of these roles.

4. What has been your proudest achievements for your apprenticeship programmes?

Seeing individuals realise their potential at all levels using this route. Winning the Apprenticeship Service Macro employer of the year for 2021. In spite of COVID restrictions and the pandemic as a whole, our learners are still reaching distinction level outcomes in terms of their End Point Assessments.

We would like to continue to improve our learning experience at North West Ambulance Service NHS Trust.

Do it, but ensure you have a model which aligns to your workforce plan and gives vision within your oganisation to the apprentice for their future.
