Maternity leave and statutory maternity pay

Redundancy

Protected learning time of an average of 6 hours per week off-the-job.

An apprenticeship agreement with their employer

At least 20 days paid holiday a year

Pay for both their working hours and the time they spend in training

Apprentices in England are employed. As part of their apprenticeship they learn and earn whilst working in a real job. They spend at least an average of 6 hours per week of their time off the job developing new skills and studying for their apprenticeship.
