


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Higher Development Award



We spoke with Vicky Johnson, a Community Health Care Support Worker in District Nursing at Hounslow and Richmond Community Healthcare, who has completed the Higher Development Award (HDA) and Level 2 Functional Skills in Maths and English.

How did you get into your current role?

Prior to children, I worked as a Senior Support Worker in a care home, I thoroughly enjoyed my role. After having children, I took a career break and then worked in food retail. I was constantly looking for a job that would give me a work/life balance and included supporting and caring for others.

I have worked at Hounslow and Richmond Community Healthcare for nearly 14 years, working as a Community Health Care Support Worker on the Night District Nursing Team, also working with the Dementia team, assisting with training and administration.

I am currently working as a Community Health Care Support worker with the District Nursing Team. Working within the trust, I have gained knowledge, clinical skills and confidence in myself and my abilities. I am fortunate that my trust has been continually guiding and encouraging my progression and development, supporting me to attend the Higher Development Awards Level 2 and 3

Why did you want to undertake the Higher Development Award?

I left school with no qualifications, and was advised to complete the Higher development Award Level 2, whilst completing my Functional Skills Level 2 in Maths and English.
