We spoke to Donna recently about her experiences of undertaking an apprenticeship, keep reading to find out more.

What apprenticeship are you studying and what does the study involve?

I am studying the Assistant Practitioner apprenticeship. It involves studying at Level 4 in year 1 and Level 5 in year 2. Attendance is 1 week every other month from home via blackboard, second year to attend one day face to face training.

What is your current job role and how did you get into your current role?

I am currently a Healthcare Assistant. I had a successful application and interview after working previously in the hospital theatre department.

What have been the biggest challenges?

Returning to education and learning to write assignments at the age of 34 after not really doing any education after secondary school.

What has been your proudest achievement on your apprenticeship to date?

To have manged to get 65 in my written work.
