What is your current job role and how did you get into your current role?

I am currently an Assistant Practitioner / Student Nurse. I was a HCA (Healthcare Assistant), I completed my Health and Social Care Degree 12 years ago. I started as Assistant Practitioner in general practice and then the opportunity arose for degree apprenticeship last year.

What have been the biggest challenges?

The biggest challenge has been time management and placement organisation from placements team.

Receiving 87% on the first assignment and being nominated and shortlisted for apprenticeship awards.
